
From the perspective of editing an unpublished content "page"

Anytime you place a Canvas Studio video into Canvas content, you are using the "rich content editor" which has a tool for selecting and embedding a Canvas Studio video. The rich content editor is found in such artifacts as content pages, assignments, announcements, and discussion topics and replies. This will show you how it works.


in Canvas, first put the page in editing mode.	O Publish
Next, write a paragraph that introduces the video.

You have the option to upload a video from your computer if you wish when the Studio window opens.




How to place a Canvas Studio Video into Canvas Content

Otherwise select a video that was previously uploaded to Studio.



If you wish to create a discussion of the video, keep the Display Media Tabs option. Click "Embed"



Save and Publish the page.

The students will see the video on the content page, and also be able to participate in a discussion directly on the video timeline. This is good for getting feedback on the video or exploring issues a little deeper.
