

Instructors who prefer to use LanSchool Air with a "Device Cart" class may see a display of computers all with the same name such as "usfdlu." It is difficult, then, to identify a student with a specific device (i.e., a computer). See the exhibit below



But it is possible to communicate with individual students with tools that are available to both the instructor and the student.

In an active Device Cart class, the instructor may select the "kebab" menu (step 1) of an individual device and view options such as "View Messages" (step 2)





The instructor can send a message to the student such as "I would like to show your work to the class" and then wait for the student's go ahead. The messages are shown at left

The instructor may then select the computer's "view full screen" icon, and display the student's computer display to the rest of the class on the projection screen.




What the student sees:

The student may access LanSchool Air on their device by selecting it from the task bar (steps 1 and 2).



The screenshot below shows that a student can raise their hand, and the instructor will see the hand signal (as shown in the inset of the teacher's workstation). The student may also initiate messages to the instructor that will be signaled on the teacher's workstation.



With these methods, ways can be found to communicate with individual students in a Device Cart class even though each device may bear the same identifier (e.g, "usfdlu").
